Producers of organic vegetable seed I

- 100% organic seed companies:
 - Organic seed production and breeding
 - Consumer and professional market
 - No patents and no GMO
 - Bingenheimer Saatgut, De Bolster
- 100% seed companies
 - Originally a family business (Rijk Zwaan, Bejo, ENZA/Vitalis)
 - Organic seed production for a limited amount of crops
 - Breeding for organic: selection and testing under organic conditions



No GMO




Producers of organic vegetable seed II

Organic breeding

- Limited to a few companies and crops
 - Tomato
 - Lettuce
 - Pumpkin
 - Zucchini
 - Cabbage





Organic breeding II

- Focus on resilience/robustness
 - Low input
 - Disease resistance
 - Drought resistance
- CMS free (cabbage crops)
- New farming systems
 - Strip cropping
 - Pixel farming
