

Organic regulation 2018/848

New cultivar categories:

- Organic varieties with possibility for adapted testing protocol
- Organic Heterogenious Material

Organic seed databases and yearly reporting on derogations

Derogation option for non-organic PRM

Category 1 crops – no derogation list





Timeline in organic EU-regulation 2018/848 to phase out derogations for non-organic PRM

Dec. 2026:

Commission report to
Parliament and
Council on availability
of organic PRM and
possible reasons for
limited availability



End of derogation option for non-organic PRM?





Jan 2029:

Possibility for delegated acts: to prolong beyond 2036 or to end the derogation option earlier



PRM regulation to replace marketing directives


Elements of the proposal:

- DUS and VSCU
- Conservation varieties and Amateur gardeners
- Organic PRM and OHM (currently out)
- Seed banks and in kind exchange
- Breeder's seeds
- Herbicide-resistant plants
- GMO, NGT

Legislative status:

April 24th 2024 adopted by Parliament with 315 proposed changes

Negotiations in Council

NGT – Categories in proposal

Category 1

- Equivalent to conventional plants
- Light regulation (labelling, register)
- Mot allowed in organic farming

-> Trilogue negotiations ongoing.

Category 2

- More complex modifications of plants
- GMO requirements (adapted)
- No opt out by member states
- Ø Not allowed in organic farming
